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A) Consider the landscape of those who are on your team.

- The obvious internal members:
 - o academic detailers, administrators, content developers
- The less-obvious external members:
 - o key players among your stakeholders
 - o target audience champions
- Tips: 1) Look for ways to build your team network and get everyone involved at some level
 - 2) Envision your team as one everyone wants to play for, then build that team

B) Build support for your team.

- Get to know each other
- Value each member for the important role that they play
- Enjoy the journey and celebrate success
- Be proactive with feedback
- Tips: 1) Ditch the hierarchy of importance and ego
 - 2) Know the team's vision, embrace it and pass it on

C) Be a great teammate.

- Be honest, positive and supportive
- Look for ways to encourage and help your teammates
- Deliver both good and bad news, and address conflict carefully but deliberately
- Tips: 1) Seek first to understand, then to be understood
 - 2) Lead by example be positive, constructive, and help set the tone for the team
